I am writing this message in a nod to tradition. Our 1976 Show Schedule (our 6th show) had a message from the President calling on all *Fellow Dahlia Enthusiasts* to hope for a bumper season and therefore a bumper show. Bob Rowarth, the President of the time, cited that the main objective of the show was to allow the continual flow of knowledge and to create friendships that enrich the dahlia world and perhaps greater humanity.

His words ring as true today as they did almost 50 years ago.

In a look behind the scenes of that show, it was held in the Victorian Horticultural Hall in Victoria Street, Melbourne from 2.00 - 8.30pm on Saturday 28th February. Admission was charged at 30 cents, but children were free. There was an entry fee for exhibitors of 5 cents per entry, except in the main championships which cost between 20 and 50 cents. The reward for the winner of the Victorian Championship - \$12 and a sash. The Victorian Championship was also much more complicated that today, calling for 12 vases, with various stipulations based on size and type. So some things have changed.

I want to highlight that this show schedule is a little different from recent years, my message to start with, but the committee has also reviewed the memorial items and undertaken to ensure that those members who have given service to the dahlia and the society, no matter how many years ago, are remembered. Check out the centre pages of this schedule for our full honour board.

In 2025, I look forward to joining with you and celebrating the Dahlia and our 65 years as a thriving society. So don't forget to enter our Sapphire Anniversary classes featured on page 17.

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS

Read the schedule carefully and ask questions if you don't understand. **Pages 5, 6 and 7** will help you understand what each schedule item requires.

Make a checklist of your entries for packing and staging on the show bench. Pack

blooms carefully to avoid damage during transportation to the show.

Allow plenty of time for staging. Don't forget your tools for cutting stems and shaping floral foam, a pen for writing labels and any other items that you will require. There will be tools available if you need something.

Floral foam and **exhibition vases** are provided. Exhibitors must provide their own baskets, bowls or containers for entries in the Just For Fun, Display and Container Sections

On arrival collect your list of entries and pack of exhibitor cards at the entry to the Craft Room. Each **exhibitor card** includes the number and title of the schedule item.

Find an area in the Craft Room to prepare exhibits. Use bins to discard waste.

Place your exhibits on the show bench with the exhibitor cards. Check that they comply with the schedule and are in the right place.

Ensure that the card lists the **dahlia types and names** where required (and where possible if not required, for the benefit of the public and other growers).

In schedule items where multiple types are called for, exhibitors are expected to name the blooms and also identify the dahlia types.

Try to leave enough time to do a final check of your entries so everything is "just right" before leaving the hall at judging time.

Experienced growers are usually available to give advice and help.

Exhibitors and volunteers are entitled to **morning tea** and **lunch** when the hall is closed for judging – served in the Meeting Room off the Craft Room.

When the show opens don't hesitate to ask questions of a Judge, Steward or Show Manager.

Rules for **Photographic Entries** are on page 25.

See the full **Show Conditions of Entry** on page 27.

Congratulations on your contribution to the show. Remember to enjoy it all!

DEFINITIONS

- **Type** Types define the standards used in judging. Consult the Society's website or the Standards and Judging Rules of the Dahlia booklet for the standards for each type.
 - The types are Formal Decorative, Informal Decorative, Semi-Decorative, Cactus, Semi-Cactus, Waterlily, Ball, Exhibition, Fimbriated, Collerette, Anemone, Stellar, Orchid, Peony and Single and Pompon.
 - Entries for Decorative schedule items can contain Formal, Informal or Semi-Decorative types.
 - Entries for Cactus schedule items can contain Cactus or Semi-cactus types.
 - Any variety not conforming to any of the standards for the types above is deemed Miscellaneous. Miscellaneous types are judged on Form, Arrangement, Condition and Freshness (also see the type standards).
 - Miscellaneous types can be entered and staged in schedule items that permit them or in the Container, Display and Cut Flower Sections.
- **Variety** A distinct cultivar, usually named. *Embrace, Jan Lennon, Karras 150* are different varieties of dahlias.
 - Where three (3) blooms are called for in one vase, they must be the same variety, unless otherwise stated.
- **Size** Miniature, Small, Medium, Large or Giant relate to specific sizes of dahlias. See page 4 for the allowable sizes for each type.
- **Show bloom** An individual flower head.
- A bi-colour bloom has two clearly defined and sharply changing colours on the face of the florets forming a regular pattern.
- A blended bloom has two or more colours that merge gradually to intermingle but are distinguishable from two metres.
- Seedling Seedlings are plants grown from seed
 - A seedling may be in the seedling class for 3 years and then named.
 - Any Seedling or New Cultivar exhibited in the Open Section that wins a Trophy or a Blue Ribbon must be named.
 - Miscellaneous dahlia seedlings can be entered in the seedling section for assessment.

A container can contain any number of stems unless otherwise stated.

A pot means a growing plant/s in a growing medium contained in a pot.

NND – Not necessarily distinct.

SIZE CLASSIFICATIONS FOR DAHLIA SHOWING

The Judging Standards incorporate the following size definitions:

- Giant 260mm and over
- Large 210mm and under 260mm
- Medium 160mm and under 210mm
- Small 120mm and under 160mm
- Miniature under 120mm

Formal Decorative, Informal Decorative, Semi-Decorative, Cactus, Semi-Cactus, Exhibition Cactus and Fimbriated dahlias come in any of the above sizes.

Ball dahlias come in the following sizes above:

- Small
- Miniature

Waterlily, Collerette, Anemone, Stellar, Orchid, Peony, and Single type dahlias should be under 160mm.

Pompon dahlias should be under 50mm

EXHIBITOR SECTIONS

The Home Gardener Section is for newcomers who grow a few dahlias.

A **Novice exhibitor** may remain in the Novice Section until they have won the Victorian Novice Championship.

An **Intermediate exhibitor** may remain in the Intermediate Section until they have won the Victorian Intermediate Championship three times providing, they have not won any Open Championship at the State Show.

The **Open Section** is open to **all exhibitors**, except where stated.

The Show Committee reserves the right to assign an exhibitor in the sections above to an appropriate section it considers consistent with the exhibitor's experience.

All other sections are open to any exhibitor.

Where the item specifies a limit for the number of plants that are grown. The number refers to those plants that are set up for showing. A reasonable additional number of dahlias could be grown as garden plants, or in pots as back up stock.

EXHIBITORS SHOULD CAREFULLY READ THE DEFINITIONS ON PAGE 6, THE DESCRIPTIONS OF THE SCHEDULE ITEMS AND THE CONDITIONS ON PAGE 27.

SHOW TROPHIES AND AWARDS

A Gold Ribbon may be awarded to the Best Dahlia Exhibit in the show. Blue Ribbons may be awarded for:

- Best dahlia over 160mm
- Best Vase of dahlias
- Best dahlia under 160mm, staged singly. The following may be awarded:
- **DSV Gold Medal** may be awarded to the best multiple vase exhibit in the dahlia section if deemed by the judges to be of exceptional merit.
- Bob Trotter Silver Medal
- RHSV SS McKay Silver Medal
- Other awards may also be presented
- DSV President's Trophy
- DSV Award of Merit Cards may be presented in each Type/Size.
- Rosettes, Ribbons or Ribbonettes for the best entry in a schedule item or set of schedule items and other placegetters in the Open, Intermediate and Novice Championships.

Exhibits staged in the Seedling Section are only eligible for the following awards:

- Seedling certificates will be awarded to blooms gaining 80 points or more
- The highest pointed seedling over 80 points will be awarded the Perpetual Kiwi Trophy.

Prize Cards will be awarded for first and second place in each item, except where otherwise noted.

Sapphire Anniversary trophies for the winning entries in Sapphire Anniversary Section.

A tied bunch, blooms head to head, five stems if larger dahlias, 10 stems if smaller dahlias, staged in the provided black display vase. Minimum length of stems 35cm, one variety.

Minimum of five stems, tied, staged in the provided black display vase. Mix of varieties allowed.

Let your creativity reign. Horticultural material must dominate. If materials have been dyed, no dye to remain in the water used in the hall. To be judged by an accredited VFAA Floral Art Judge, under AFAA rules. Area allowed 75cm.

Dahlias must be used but do not need to dominate.

PHOTOGRAPHIC CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

MAXIMUM OF 5 ENTRIES PER EXHIBITOR PER ITEM

- All images must be created by the exhibitor.
- Total size of entry, including mount, not to exceed 20cm x 25cm (8" x 10"). No glass or frames permitted.
- All exhibits must have the exhibitors name and the item number on the back.
- Captions on prints or mountings are encouraged and may be considered when judging.
- Photos that have been digitally altered beyond standard optimization (removal of dust, cropping, reasonable adjustments to exposure, colour and contrast, etc.) will be disqualified except for "Digital Darkroom" item.

JUNIOR SECTION

Ribbonettes will be awarded in each item for 1st, 2nd and 3rd

SHOW CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- All exhibits must be made in the name of the bona fide actual grower.
- Two or more persons may not separately exhibit the same type of exhibit for the competition from the same garden.
- Children and teenagers may show separately if exhibits are grown in a separate plot.
- Exhibitor cards are to be collected and placed in front of exhibits prior to judging.
- No exhibitor will be allowed in the hall whilst judging is in progress unless authorised.
- The judges' decisions are final.
- The judges may withhold prizes from exhibits that are not of sufficient merit.
- The Show Manager has the right to reject, refuse or relocate any exhibit which in his/her opinion is not eligible or worthy of showing.
- All exhibits shall be considered the property of the Society until the close of the show.
- The Committee will endeavour to care for all exhibits but will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to any exhibit.
- The Committee may request an exhibitor to submit his or her garden for inspection before or after the show.
- Wiring (or any artificial support) of exhibits is prohibited unless specified otherwise.
- Standard vases are provided and must be used unless otherwise specified.
- Where tables are tiered no other item of staging is permitted.
- Where an exhibit is marked Not According to Schedule (NAS) it takes no further part in any award.
- Any exhibitor desiring to protest must lodge such protest in writing with \$20 to the Show Manager by 5 pm on the first day of the show. A protest will only be considered on the grounds of the non-accordance of an exhibit with the schedule. All disputes will be determined by a panel of three Committee members and the Show Manager.
- The panel is empowered to determine any protest and to retain the \$20 if it considers the protest frivolous.
- The Dahlia Society of Victoria Inc. is not liable in any way if the show is cancelled for any reason.
- The Show Manager and Show Sub-Committee are authorised to make alterations to this schedule in extraordinary circumstances.
- All prize money to be collected from the Treasurer before the close of show, money not collected will revert to the society's funds.
- The Show Manager reserves the right to relocate entries after judging.
- The Committee reserves the right to ask any exhibitor to exhibit in a higher section.
- Exhibitors are **asked** to name all blooms and identify types.
